Household Hazardous Material (HHM) Collection

@ the Iowa City Landfill and Recycling Center (3900 Hebl Ave. SW)

How to use the facility:

The facility accepts hazardous material at no cost from residents of Johnson County, Riverside, and Kalona, and is **open Thursday**, **Friday and Saturday**, **7 a.m. to 2 p.m.**, no appointment needed.

- Inventory your items.
- ► Keep items in original, sealed, upright containers. Label unmarked containers. Never mix chemicals.
- Visit the facility during open hours only. When you arrive, pull up to the facility overhang.

Are you a business? Call us @ 319-887-6160 to learn how to dispose of hazardous material. Appointment required.





Visit the **Swap Shop** (during facility open hours only) for partially-consumed or unopened products such as paint, cleaning supplies, and auto fluids. Help yourself—there is no cost.

Tips to avoid problems with hazardous material:

- ▶ Look for safer, non-toxic alternatives.
- ▶ Buy only the amount you need. Give unused HHM to someone who can use it.
- Keep in the original, labeled containers and store upright away from children and pets.

Other Recycling Programs:

Used vegetable oil, motor oil and oil filters can be disposed of at the Oil Recycling Shed at the Landfill. Place in a sealed, labeled container.

Below are examples of accepted materials.

Cleaning Products: abrasive cleaner aerosols carpet cleaner disinfectant drain cleaner dry cleaning solution fabric softener floor care product furniture polish grout/tile cleaner metal polish mildew remover oven cleaner multi-purpose cleaner stain remover toilet bowl cleaner

Garage/Workshop: adhesive/glue antifreeze battery acid brake fluid engine degreaser gasoline/oil kerosene lighter fluid oil-based paint (20-gal limit)

paint thinner resin solvent stain stripper transmission fluid varnish Lawn/Outdoor: bug spray fertilizer

fogger fungicide insecticide insect repellent pesticides pool chemicals rodent killer weed killer Light Bulbs:

fluorescent tube LFD

Batteries: all kinds



Batteries in Trash = Landfill Fires



Batteries should <u>not</u> go in the trash. For a list of battery drop-off locations, visit <u>icgov.org/hhm</u>.

Other: hair remover medications (non-controlled

substances)

mercury thermostat moth balls nail polish/remover photo chemicals shoe polish syringes/sharps (contain in rigid plastic or metal container with lid)

thermometer fire extinguishers

What about latex paint?

Latex paint is water-based and non-hazardous. Thickened latex paint is regular trash. Thicken by mixing in kitty litter or shredded paper until it gets to a cottage cheese consistency. Reduce latex paint waste with tips listed at icgov.org/hhm.

The following materials are not accepted:

Smoke detectors: Place in trash. Electronic thermostats: Recycle via electronics recycling at the Landfill.

Ammunition and explosives
Radioactive materials
Infectious medical waste

Propane cylinders: Recycle with Ferrel Gas or A-1 Propane. Residential tanks can be recycled for \$1 via appliance recycling at the Landfill.

Controlled substance medications: Properly dispose of at DEA event or drop-off locations listed at icgov.org/pills.
